


## COME & SEE !

In his message for World Day of Vocations Pope Francis says "As with every call, the Gospel speaks of an encounter". The same thing happens in our lives be it a call to the priesthood or to married life. "We were surprised by an encounter, and at that moment we glimpsed the promise of a joy capable of bringing fulfilment to our lives".

Pope Francis talks about the paralysis of routine - how we can all get caught up in the routine of life. He invites us to be courageous and to take a risk for God's promise. He encourages us, especially the young, not to be deaf to the Lord's call; "there can be no greater joy than to risk one's life for the Lord!"

Over the next few weeks we will reflect on the vocations taken by those in our own parish and together pray that Christian families will give to the Church helpers in the work of tomorrow.
