MISSION SUNDAY : SUNDAY 18TH OCTOBER 2020

It's been one of those years that most of us will never forget. Due to the coronavirus, churches were closed and the mission of Christ looked as though it was put on hold. But thanks to Facebook and webcams, this mission continued with Mass and prayer services broadcast to people's homes. It was a new way of living one's faith.

This year's Mission Sunday theme "Together we can do more - Blessed are the peacemakers" is highlighting that our Church is a global community that must stand together if it is to do more. COVID-19 brings much fear, but it also shows us that selfless and courageous actions are not reserved solely for saints. In fact they are found in every one of us, and that by acting together we can achieve more. The theme recognises our missionaries as peacemakers. In many of the poorest parishes around the world it is the missionaries who are on the front line. The needs of mission dioceses vary greatly from medical and food supplies, to education and infrastructure - it could be to provide a motorbike so that a priest can celebrate Mass in remote villages.

This year's Mission Sunday collection is not only a lifeline to the missionaries but also to the future of the Church. This weekend please give generously so missionaries will be able to work with the poorest of the poor in being there to celebrate the sacraments and preach the gospel.

COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS as you are aware the NI Executive announced further restrictions, arising from the COVID-19 pandemic. As they apply to churches, the following are the additional restrictions: **1.** Churches will remain open, but people must wear masks to enter or leave the church - this is mandatory.

2. Funerals and Weddings are restricted to only 25 people. It would appear this restriction does not apply to other Masses or Services.

In light of these restrictions and the increase in positive cases of Covid-19, we ask everyone to continue to co-operate with the current and additional regulations:

- Maintain the 2 meter rule within the church and when entering and exiting.
- Sanitise your hands entering and exiting the church.
- Masks are to be worn in the church.
- If you are experiencing COVID symptoms please stay at home to protect others.
