Parish Accounts for the Year 2018

The members of the Parish Finance Council present the 2018 Annual Financial Report (detailed information is available on request from the parish office). Thanks to your generosity, overall, we are in a good financial position. We continue to face the same challenges into the future as other parishes – as you see from the very slight reduction in the envelope collection figure. Operating and property costs remain similar to the previous year. The increase in the priests' salaries figure reflects the addition of our deacon - and I trust we all agree Rev. Declan is a welcome addition and an asset to pur parish family.

2018, the year of Pope Francis' visit to Ireland was an exciting time for our parish. Much energy was put into organising activities as we celebrated family life and attended the Pastoral Congress, Festival of Families and the Papal Mass in Dublin.

During 2018, the Finance Council presented a three year plan for Cappagh to the Diocesan Building and Development Committee, which has received the necessary approval. This plan includes much needed works at Christ the King Church and the Parish Centre. It also includes an extension to the graveyard in Killyclogher. A sub-committee has been working very hard on this, and has made every possible effort to realise the project; but unfortunately, due to circumstances and problems beyond our control, plans for a graveyard extension are now on hold.

Moving forward in 2019 we are working on the following:

Christ the King Church: Building control approval has been received. Works at the Church include making the exterior more aesthetically pleasing by redesigning the porches and courtyard. This will also make the building more energy efficient. Additional car parking spaces will also be created at the top entrance for use by the elderly and those with limited mobility.

Mountfield Church: a number of minor works will be carried out. A small donation will be made to Mountfield Community Association towards the new community hall.

Knockmoyle Church: There are future plans for a condition survey to be carried out.

Parish Centre: A feasibility study will be conducted. The current large, open planned hall is not energy efficient and is in need of modernisation. It operates at a cost to the parish each year. The Finance Council will work closely with the Killyclogher and District Development Association (KADDA) to ensure that the parish centre, though not a business venture, will be able to sustain itself at no cost to the parish. The parish centre is in need of much-needed development and is envisioned to be a "hub" of the community, embracing parish life and an important outreach from our Church into the community.

As I reflect over the past year and look to the years ahead, I am aware of the strength of our community and mindful of the many blessings we have in our parish. I, and every one of us, are extremely grateful to all who participate in and help to build our parish life - the hundreds of generous volunteers who minister in the many pastoral activities in, and beyond the walls of the Church; those who fundraise, those who coordinate and support the parish draw, the entertainments and dance committee who give of their time and talent.

As we move towards 2020, when we will celebrate the 200th Anniversary of the opening of St Mary's Church, Killyclogher, I hope and pray that together we are positioning our parish for the next 200 years to be a community of faith that is vibrant and strong in faith and good works. I thank you – the parishioners of Cappagh – It is only with your support that the mission of our parish can continue on a sure and firm footing into the future. *Fr Kevin*
