Love is often shown by little things, by attention to the little details that make people feel at home.

In today's first reading, a woman of rank makes the prophet Elisha feel at home. She had resources that the poor widow with the two copper coins did not have. She began by insisting that Elisha break his journey to come in and have a meal with herself and her husband. Then, she went further and built a little room on the roof of her house and put a bed, chair, table and lamp on it, so that Elisha could lie down and rest.

She gave more than a cup of cold water, because she had the material resources to do so. Yet, behind both the giving of a cup of cold water to someone and the woman's more elaborate actions of hospitality lie the same attentiveness to the needs of the other and a willingness to give what one can to meet those needs.

It is such hospitable actions towards others, no matter how small, that creates openings for the coming of God's kingdom on earth. The need to create such openings is all the greater in a world where some people are determined to inflict unspeakable terror on men, women and children.

Jesus declares in today's gospel reading that when we lose our life in love for others we find our life. When we give the cup of cold water, or more if we are able to do so, we begin to become the person the Lord calls us to and desires us to be. We begin to become fully alive with the life of Jesus, the life of God.

In the words of Paul at the end of today's second reading, we become "alive for God in Christ Jesus".
